
Welcome to our latest newsletter. We send out monthly updates like this to keep you updated on our latest news and client stories.

leva's partner left her and her two young children a few months ago. This resulted in them having to move to another property but unfortunately, they didn't have any means of cooking, no fridge and hardly any furniture. The family had to live on takeaways for months.

Through Acts 435 we were able to find funding to purchase a cooker and table and chairs. In the meantime, she had managed to get a fridge herself.

When the cooker was delivered, it became apparent that there was no CCU fitted in the kitchen, which meant installation couldn't take place. We decided we couldn't leave a family without any way of cooking over the Christmas period so we purchased a small tabletop oven with hotplates so they could still have a Christmas dinner. They were overjoyed.

leva says "For the first time I'm really happy. I feel that Reach has made me feel very comfortable. This is the first time I've had to ask for help and it was hard as I've always done things myself. Thank you for everything you have done".
